Winter Break Camp at the Science Center is a great opportunity to keep your kids active and engaged over winter vacation, and get them to take a break from all the new electronic gadgets they got as gifts. This year, the Science Center is offering nine different camps for kids in kindergarten through eighth grade. Kids can attend for a single day, or the entire series! Camps are divided by age and content is tailored to the different grade levels. School break camps are \$55 per day (\$50 for members) and run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., with an option for an extended day from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. for an additional fee. Winter Break Camp kicks off on Monday, December 19 and runs through Friday, December 30 (no camp on Monday, December 26). This year’s themes include Animation Station, Good Vibrations – Science of Sound, Space: To Infinity and Beyond, CSI: The Case of the Finicky Flu, From Here to There: Transportation, Amazing Architect, Outbreak: The Science of Survival, Spark Space: Toy Extravaganza and LEGO: Arctic Exploration.

The Science Center’s camp program is the only STEM-based camp in Ohio to be accredited by the American Camp Association, which means it meets or exceeds more than 300 different standards related to safety, program operation, staff training and more.
