CLEVELAND (January 11, 2019) – Great Lakes Science Center's hands-on, head-to-head engineering fundraiser Design & Build returns for its eighth annual competition Saturday, February 9 from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

On the day of the competition, teams of two to eight individuals are given a design challenge, and all the materials needed to solve it. They must then race against the clock, and the other teams, to see who can design, build and then test the most successful solution to the challenge. Teams compete in one of two categories: Youth (middle through high school students), or Corporate (adult teams or college students). An objective system of points determines the winners. Science Center guests on the day of the event are invited to check out the competition and help cheer the teams on to victory!

"Design & Build is always an exciting event," said Science Center President & CEO Dr. Kirsten Ellenbogen. "It is impressive to see the creative spirit of our youth teams and the strength of the competition among our corporate teams. Last year's challenge was tough, but Telos Alliance came out on top in the corporate division and one of the teams from the Science Center's Great Science Academy won the youth division. We're looking forward to another unique design challenge for this year's event!"
